

Dear Parent/Carer,

At Lionheart Academies Trust we value the partnership between school, student, and parents/carers and believe that together we can achieve more. We regularly communicate with our students and parents/carers about attainment, progress and attitude to learning throughout the year. We continually assess students on their learning journey and provide a Data Snapshot report to share this information so that careful reflections can be made and actions taken where necessary.

This first Data Snapshot report is focused wholly on Year 7 students' attitude to learning in the first half term.

At Key Stage 3 students are developing their skills and knowledge across the secondary curriculum, building towards preparation for GCSE study in Key Stage 4.

Across the trust we use an assessment model to track how far students have progressed towards meeting subject level expectations. A student's level of performance is captured in the following bands:

KS2 Scaled Scores (SATs) in reading and mathematics are used as a starting point for all students to monitor and track that they are developing in-line with expected levels of performance; all students will have clear targets relative to their starting point (this is displayed on the report).

On the Data Snapshot we report on the following:

| Behaviour Points | This is the number of points that have been recorded for poor and challenging behaviour (<i>this may include low level issues relating to organisation/punctuality etc. as well as more serious issues of poor behaviour</i>) |
